This document is a Consent Agreement, effective when signed by all parties, regarding disciplinary action against the former license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Maine held by Pamela S. Shervanick, D.O. The parties to the Consent Agreement are: Pamela S. Shervanick, D.O. (“Dr. Shervanick”), the State of Maine Board of Osteopathic Licensure (“the Board”), and the State of Maine Office of the Attorney General. This Consent Agreement is entered into pursuant to 10 M.R.S. § 8003(5)(B) and 32 M.R.S. § 2591-A.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. Dr. Shervanick held a license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Maine from January 15, 2016 (license number DO2564), specializing in psychiatry, until November 30, 2025, when she elected not to renew her license.
2. On September 26, 2024, the Board received a complaint about Dr. Shervanick’s treatment of a patient with psychosis who committed suicide. The Board docketed the complaint as CR2024-44 and sent it to Dr. Shervanick for a response.
3. By letter dated November 19, 2024, Dr. Shervanick responded to the complaint.

4. The Board has also received an expert report from Jeffery S. Barkin, M.D., who found concerns with Dr. Shervanick's treatment of this patient.

5. The Board and Dr. Shervanick previously agreed to an Interim Consent Agreement that has restricted her practice since it became effective on May 12, 2025.

6. Pursuant to 32 M.R.S. § 2591-A(2)(F), the Board may impose discipline for engaging in unprofessional conduct. A licensee is considered to have engaged in unprofessional conduct if the licensee violates a standard of professional behavior that has been established for the practice of medicine

7. Absent Dr. Shervanick's acceptance of this Consent Agreement by signing and dating it in front of a notary and returning it to the Board of Osteopathic Licensure, osteop.pfr@maine.gov, 142 State House Station, Augusta, Maine 04333-0137 by January 22, 2026, the matter will return to the Board to consider proceeding to an adjudicatory hearing.

COVENANTS

8. Dr. Shervanick admits that if the Board found by a preponderance of the evidence that the conduct complained of constitutes unprofessional conduct, that finding could be grounds for discipline pursuant to 32 M.R.S. § 2591-A(2)(F).

9. Dr. Shervanick agrees to accept, and the Board imposes:

A REQUIREMENT that Dr. Shervanick will not reapply for licensure in Maine for at least five years from the effective date of this Consent Agreement.

10. Violation by Dr. Shervanick of any of the terms or conditions of this Consent Agreement shall constitute grounds for discipline, including but not limited to modification, suspension, or revocation of licensure or the denial of re-licensure.

11. This Consent Agreement is not appealable and is effective until modified or rescinded in writing by the parties hereto.

12. The Board and the Office of the Attorney General may communicate and cooperate regarding Dr. Shervanick or any other matter relating to this Consent Agreement.

13. This Consent Agreement is a public record within the meaning of 1 M.R.S. § 402 and will be available for inspection and copying by the public pursuant to 1 M.R.S. § 408-A.

14. This Consent Agreement constitutes discipline and is an adverse licensing action that is reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank (NPDB), the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), and other licensing jurisdictions.

15. Nothing in this Consent Agreement shall be construed to affect any right or interest of any person not a party hereto. If any clause of this Consent Agreement is deemed illegal or invalid, then that clause shall be deemed severed from this Consent Agreement.

16. Dr. Shervanick acknowledges by her signature hereto that she has read this Consent Agreement, that she has had an opportunity to consult with an attorney before executing this Consent Agreement, that she has executed this Consent Agreement of her own free will and that she agrees to abide by all terms and conditions set forth herein.

17. This Consent Agreement may be signed in counterparts, with all counterparts together constituting one original instrument. Signatures below may be applied and/or saved electronically, and such electronic signatures will be given the same effect as a paper document signed in ink.

18. For the purposes of this Consent Agreement, the terms “execution” and “effective date” mean the date on which the final signature is affixed to this Consent Agreement.

I, PAMELA S. SHERVANICK, D.O., HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING CONSENT AGREEMENT. I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING IT, THAT I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN THIS CONSENT AGREEMENT VOLUNTARILY, WITHOUT ANY THREAT OR PROMISE. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS CONSENT AGREEMENT CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND, VERBAL, WRITTEN OR OTHERWISE.






