This document is an Interim Consent Agreement, effective when signed by all parties, regarding disciplinary action against the license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Maine held by Trung N. Nguyen, D.O. The parties to the Consent Agreement are: Trung N. Nguyen, D.O. (“Dr. Nguyen”), the State of Maine Board of Osteopathic Licensure (“the Board”), and the State of Maine Office of the Attorney General. This Consent Agreement is entered into pursuant to 10 M.R.S. § 8003(5)(B) and 32 M.R.S. § 2591-A.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. Dr. Nguyen has held a license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Maine since August 28, 2018 (license number DO2800) and specializes in emergency and intensive care medicine.
2. On May 18, 2023, the Board issued an Order of Immediate Suspension of Dr. Nguyen’s license pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 10004(3).
3. The Board at its meeting on May 11, 2023, authorized the offer of an interim consent agreement to continue the suspension of Dr. Nguyen’s license beyond that authorized pursuant to 5 M.R.S. § 10004(3) until this matter can be considered and resolved.
4. The Board at its regularly scheduled meeting on June 8, 2023 will consider Dr. Nguyen’s response to the Board complaint and subpoena.

5. This Interim Consent Agreement has been negotiated by legal counsel to Dr. Nguyen and legal counsel to the Board. Absent Dr. Nguyen's acceptance of this Consent Agreement by signing and dating it in front of a notary and returning it to the Board of Osteopathic Licensure, [osteo.pfr@maine.gov](mailto:osteo.pfr@maine.gov), 142 State House Station, Augusta, Maine 04333-0137 on or before May 26, 2023, the Board and the State of Maine Office of the Attorney General will proceed to an adjudicatory hearing around June 18, 2023.

#### COVENANTS

6. Dr. Nguyen agrees to the continued SUSPENSION of his license to practice as an osteopathic physician in the State of Maine effective upon the execution of this Interim Consent Agreement, which suspension shall remain in effect until such time as the matter is resolved by adjudicatory hearing or other Board action.

7. This Consent Agreement is not appealable and is effective until modified or rescinded in writing by the parties hereto.

8. The Board and the Office of the Attorney General may communicate and cooperate regarding Dr. Nguyen or any other matter relating to this Consent Agreement.

9. This Interim Consent Agreement is a public record within the meaning of 1 M.R.S. § 402 and will be available for inspection and copying by the public pursuant to 1 M.R.S. § 408-A.

10. This Interim Consent Agreement constitutes discipline and is an adverse licensing action that is reportable to the National Practitioner Data

Bank (NPDB), the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB), and other licensing jurisdictions.

11. Nothing in this Interim Consent Agreement shall be construed to affect any right or interest of any person not a party hereto. If any clause of this Consent Agreement is deemed illegal or invalid, then that clause shall be deemed severed from this Interim Consent Agreement.

12. Dr. Nguyen acknowledges by his signature hereto that he has read this Interim Consent Agreement, that he has had an opportunity to consult with an attorney before executing this Consent Agreement, that he executed this Consent Agreement of his own free will and that he agrees to abide by all terms and conditions set forth herein.

13. Dr. Nguyen has been represented by Stephen Angelette, Esq. and Shelby Zumwalt, Esq., who have participated in the negotiation of the terms of this Interim Consent Agreement.

14. This Consent Agreement may be signed in counterparts, with all counterparts together constituting one original instrument. Signatures below may be applied and/or saved electronically, and such electronic signatures will be given the same effect as a paper document signed in ink.

15. For the purposes of this Interim Consent Agreement, the terms "execution" and "effective date" mean the date on which the final signature is affixed to this Consent Agreement.

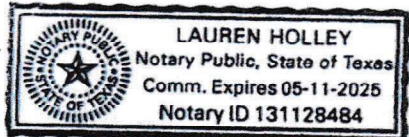
