**LICENSE REVOCATION  
NOTICE, ORDER,  
and  
OPPORTUNITY FOR  
HEARING**

**NOTICE TO WILLIAM MCCLURE**

Effective as of **April 1, 2026**, your Maine nonresident insurance producer license will be **REVOKED** without further formal proceedings unless you request a hearing as specified below.

The reasons for your license revocation are as follows:

1. On or around November 26, 2025, you applied for a Maine nonresident insurance producer license.
2. In your application, you certified that the information in the application was true and correct under penalty of perjury and that “submitting false information or omitting pertinent or material information...is grounds for license revocation or denial.”
3. In your application, you answered “No” and provided no accompanying documentation in response to the following question:

Are you currently a party to, or have you ever been found liable in, any lawsuit, arbitrations or mediation proceeding involving allegations of fraud, misappropriation or conversion of funds, misrepresentation or breach of fiduciary duty? If you answer yes, you must attach to this application: a) a written statement summarizing the details of each incident, b) a copy of the Petition, Complaint or other document that commenced the lawsuit, arbitration, or mediation proceedings, and c) a copy of the official documents, which demonstrates the resolution of the charges or any final judgment.

4. You and Benefit Health Plan, Inc., a company for which you hold multiple officer roles, are named defendants in Case 1:25-cv-03590-WMR in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia. You and Benefit Health Plan, Inc. are alleged to have used an insurer’s trademark without authorization to induce consumers to purchase invalid health insurance products and to have committed other acts involving fraud and misrepresentation.
5. You, Benefit Logistics Captive Insurance Company (of which you are the director and hold multiple officer roles), Benefit Logistics, Inc. (of which you are the President) Benefit Risk Advisors, Inc. (of which you are an officer), and McClure Benefit Administrators d/b/a

MBA TPA (of which you hold multiple officer roles) are all named defendants in Case 3:25-cv-01164-JEP-LLL in the United States District Court Middle District of Florida Jacksonville Division. You and the above-mentioned entities are alleged to have engaged in two fraud schemes to issue counterfeit insurance policies and counterfeit certificates of insurance, to have used a company's trademark without authorization, and to have committed other acts involving fraud and misrepresentation.

6. Benefit Logistics Captive Insurance Company, McClure Benefit Administrators, Medi TPA, LLC (of which you were a managing member), and "William A. McClure d/b/a Competitive Edge Risk Solutions" are all named defendants in Case: 2025-CP-10-02844 in the Court of Common Pleas for the Ninth Judicial Circuit in the State of South Carolina, County of Charleston. You and the above-mentioned entities are alleged to have defrauded the plaintiffs and the public and committed other acts involving fraud and misrepresentation.
7. On December 22, 2025, Bureau staff sent an information request to you at your mailing and email addresses on file with the Bureau. As part of these communications, the Bureau requested that you provide certain information, including information regarding your involvement with the various proceedings described above.
8. The Bureau was seeking this information pursuant to 24-A M.R.S. § 220(1). Your response was required within 10 business days pursuant to 24-A M.R.S. § 220(2).
9. You have failed to respond to this inquiry.
10. Your failure to disclose that you are a current party to multiple proceedings involving allegations of fraud, misappropriation or conversion of funds, misrepresentation or breach of fiduciary duty constitutes grounds for the revocation of your Maine nonresident insurance producer license application pursuant to 24-A M.R.S. § 1420-K(1)(A)(B)(C).
11. Your failure to respond to the Bureau's December 22, 2025, inquiry constitutes grounds for the revocation of your Maine nonresident insurance producer license pursuant to 24-A M.R.S. §§ 1420-K(1)(A)(B) and 220(2).

Therefore, based upon the above grounds, your Maine resident insurance producer license is **REVOKED** as of **April 1, 2026**, pursuant to 24-A M.R.S. §§ 1417 and 1420-K, subject to your right to request a hearing.


**Under the Maine Insurance Code, specifically 24-A M.R.S. §§ 1417 and 1420-K, you have the right to a hearing before the Superintendent or his designee. If you request a hearing, you will have the right to present evidence and arguments in your defense, and the staff of the Bureau of Insurance will bear the burden of proving each violation by a preponderance of the evidence.**

**If you request a hearing, you will receive further communication regarding scheduling. The matters to be determined through the hearing process are whether you committed one or more of the violations listed above, and if so, the appropriate sanctions for those violations. The sanctions imposed after a hearing can include any available remedy under applicable laws, including the payment of civil penalties.**

**To request a hearing, you must notify the Bureau of Insurance in writing no later than April 1, 2026. If you do not file a written request for a hearing within 30 days from the time you knew or reasonably should have known of this act through this Notice and Order, you will lose your right to request a hearing on this license revocation Notice and Order.**
