

Maine Carrier Credentialing Extension Application

Public Law 2022 Chapter 603, effective August 8, 2022, requires that a carrier which is unable to make a provider credentialing decision within 60 days of receiving a completed application must apply to the Maine Bureau of Insurance, prior to the end of the 60-day period, to request an extension. In the application, the carrier must explain why the credentialing decision is taking longer than permitted. If the problem is not specific to a particular application, the carrier must submit for approval a remediation plan to bring its credentialing process in compliance with the 60-day statutory time limit.
