Development of a pastoral identity and the integration of the person of the student chaplain into the ministry are the central goals. A typical program of clinical pastoral education includes ministry to individuals and their families, written reports of visits reviewed in individual and/or group supervision, group dynamics sessions, and didactic seminars. The ministry is in the context of teamwork with other professionals.</i>
