Changes to Degree Requirements Effective September 19, 2019

The Appraiser Trainee license (RA) does not require a degree.

The Licensed Residential license (AP) no longer requires a degree.

The Certified Residential license (CR) now has 6 options for college degree equivalency. (See below) The Certified General license (CG) still requires a Bachelor's degree, but <u>no</u> equivalency options.
