IMPORTANT NOTICE: Incomplete applications will not be considered. Pursuant to Maine Fuel Board Rules Chapter 4.13.2 – Incomplete or Illegible Applications "Incomplete or illegible applications will be returned to the applicant together with any attachments."

Complete and submit an Examination Application and supporting documents to the Maine Fuel Board. Be sure to complete all fields of the Examination Application.

	Affidavits demonstrating <u>4 years</u> of <u>licensed</u> practical experience as an oil burner technician for at least <u>2 of the 4 years</u> was as a <u>licensed journeyman</u> oil burner technician. The affidavits must be completed and signed by your supervising master oil burner technician; and
	Examination application completed, signed and dated.
MAS	STER EXAMINATION OUT-OF-STATE APPLICANTS:
	Affidavits demonstrating a minimum of <u>4 years</u> of <u>licensed</u> practical experience as an oil burner technician for at least <u>2 of the 4 years</u> was as a <u>licensed</u> <u>journeyman</u> oil burner technician. The affidavits must be completed and signed by your supervising master oil burner technician; and
	Oil burner technician license copies; and
	Satisfactory evidence of experience in installing, cleaning, servicing, altering and repairing oil and solid fuel burning equipment (Employment Record); and
	Examination application completed, signed and dated

JOURNEYMAN EXAMINATION:

A. If you have completed an oil burner technician course consisting of a minimum of 160 hours of study of which at least 75 hours are made up of lab work at a career

	and technical education center, at a community college or at a comparable institute in Maine or another state:
	Transcript copy showing completion of the oil burner technician course (Nora Bronze is NOT recognized by the Maine Fuel Board and is NOT acceptable proof of completion of the requisite education; only a transcript copy is acceptable proof of completion); and
	Examination application completed, signed and dated.
В.	If you have completed a minimum one-year accredited heating course at a Maine community college consisting, at minimum, of 320 hours of study of which at least 150 hours are made up of lab work:
	Transcript copy detailing your matriculation date from the Maine community college heating course with credit hours, including lab hours; and
	Examination application completed, signed and dated.
C.	If you have one year of licensed practical experience as an apprentice oil burner technician:
	Affidavit(s) demonstrating one year of <u>licensed</u> practical experience as an oil burner technician. The affidavit(s) must be completed and signed by your supervising master oil burner technician; and
	Examination application completed, signed and dated.
D.	. If you are an out-of-state applicant with one year of licensed practical experience:
	Affidavit(s) demonstrating one year of <u>licensed</u> practical experience as an oil burner technician; and
	Oil burner technician license copy; and Satisfactory evidence of experience in installing, cleaning, servicing, altering and repairing oil and solid fuel burning equipment (Employment Record); and
	Examination application completed, signed and dated.

10 DAY NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Pursuant to 10 M.R.S §8003-G, any change in name, address, email address, criminal convictions, disciplinary actions, or any material change set forth in your original application for licensure must be reported to The Maine Fuel Board within 10 days.

APPLICATION PROCESSING TIME:

Your application has a greater chance of being processed expeditiously if it is complete and all supporting documents are included. After your application has been received your name will appear when you complete a "licensee search" on your name as you entered it on your application. The status will appear as "Pending Exam." This is not an actual examination approval at this point; it is simply a verification that an application has been received and is in the queue for review.
