- Examine quality of books, records, applications, internal controls, client files, correspondence and related transactions in order to determine transactions are conducted in accordance with applicable law, regulations and policy
- Analyze and evaluate financial transactions and positions and monitor company operations to ensure they operate consistent with legal requirements
- Develop and maintain accurate restitution records and contact restitution recipients as required
- Meet with and maintain contact with securities firms and industry professionals in order to discuss examination findings
- Assist investigative staff with the review and analysis of financial and transactional information as part of consumer complaint and enforcement activities
- Testify at hearings in order to explain examination findings
- Prepare examination reports with findings and recommendations as well as supporting data
