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You must use this Worksheet to calculate the reduction of your standard deduction amount or itemized deduction amount if your estimated Maine adjusted gross income for 2017 is greater than \$70,000 if single or married filing separately; \$105,000 if head of household; or \$140,000 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).

1.	Enter your estimated 2017 Maine adjusted gross income1	
2.	Enter \$70,000 if single or married filing separately; \$105,000 if head of household; or 2 \$140,000 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).	
3.	Subtract line 2 from line 1. If zero or less, do not complete this worksheet - your deduction is not subject to the phaseout	
4.	Enter \$75,000 if single or married filing separately; \$112,500 if head of household; or 4 \$150,000 if married filing jointly or qualifying widow(er).	
5.	Divide line 3 by line 4. If one or more, enter 1.00005	·
6.	Enter the 2017 standard deduction amount for your filing status or your total estimated 2017 Maine itemized deductions*, whichever applies	
7.	Multiply line 6 by line 57	
8.	Estimated 2017 Maine itemized deductions or standard deduction. Subtract line 7 from line 6. Enter this amount on your 2017 Estimated Tax Worksheet, line 6a	

*See Form 1040ME, Schedule 2 and related instructions. Except for medical and dental expenses included in federal itemized deductions, the maximum 2017 Maine itemized deductions that may be claimed is \$28,600.
