

#### MICHAEL FORTIN

Michael Fortin has worked at Maine Revenue Services for 23 years. He has worked in various leadership roles within the Compliance Division, including Division Director of the Tax Compliance Unit and Criminal Investigation Unit. Michael is the Director of Promotion for the Maine Tax Portal and serves as emcee and organizer for the annual State Tax Symposium. He is a graduate of Thomas College.

#### **DAVID SAWYER**

David Sawyer is a Certified General Real Estate Appraiser, as well as a Certified Maine Assessor. He began his assessing career with the Town of New Gloucester, Maine in 1983, and spent more than thirty years as an assessor for multiple municipalities, as well as ten years as the Geographic Information System (GIS) coordinator for the Town of Windham, before becoming an appraiser in 2017. He currently works as an appraiser for Northstar Appraisal in Portland, Maine, and is the owner of Sawyer Education Services. David has taught courses for Maine Revenue Services, the University of Southern Maine, the Appraisal Foundation, the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO), and Sawyer Educational Services. He holds a bachelor's degree in liberal arts from the University of Connecticut and is a candidate for a master's in education from Capella University.

#### PETER LACY

Peter Lacy started with Maine Revenue Services (MRS) in 2008 as an auditor in the Sales, Fuel & Special Tax Division. He currently serves as Director of the Property Tax Division of Maine Revenue Services. During his time at MRS, Peter has also served as the Assistant General Counsel in the Office of General Counsel, and Deputy Director in the Sales, Fuel & Special Tax Division. Peter holds a bachelor's degree in economics and a J.D. from the University of Maine School of Law. He is also a Certified Maine Assessor.



#### **MEAGAN HENNESSEY**

Meagan Hennessey is the Director of the PFAS Response Program at the Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation, and Forestry, where she has been since the program's inception in 2022. The Program is responsible for technical and financial support for PFAS-impacted commercial agricultural operations, providing individual recommendations to maintain farm viability. Previously, she managed the Municipal Services section of the Property Tax Division at Maine Revenue Services and maintains her Certified Maine Assessor Level 3 credential. Meagan has a BA in Environmental Science and Honors Economics from Colby College.

#### **MATT DUBE**

Dr. Matt Dube is Associate Professor of Data Science, Computer Information Systems, and Applied Mathematics at the University of Maine at Augusta and the current Chair of the Maine GIS User Group. Dr. Dube's academic background is in geospatial and temporal data, ranging from intuitive human spatiotemporal query systems to applications of spatial analysis to critical social problems surrounding rural housing insecurity, redistricting, and rural incarceration. Dr. Dube teaches courses in data science, geography, public administration, and emergency management at UMA during his day-to-day functions.

#### KEVIN KEENE

Kevin Keene served the City of Philadelphia for over 30 years as a Real Property Evaluator; Mass Appraisal Analyst; Real Property Supervisor; Appeals, Customer Service and Exemptions Administrator; GIS Manager; Residential Administrator; Modeling Director and Director of Mass Appraisal and Analysis. He has personally designed and directed over sixteen major revaluation projects. He has trained appraisers, modelers and analysts, and has been a frequent presenter and facilitator at the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO) and Urban and Regional Information Systems (URISA) conferences.

In semi-retirement he is the principal at Keene Mass Appraisal Consulting (keenemac.com), offering a variety of mass appraisal and educational services to clients around the world.

#### How do I access the event from my device?

#### May I ask questions during the sessions?

Yes. During the Academy, attendees may type questions to the presenters by using the Q/A tab at the bottom of the Zoom page. If there is time, the presenter will field as many questions as possible. The "Raise Hand" feature in Zoom will not be utilized at the Property Tax Academy.

#### What happens if the poll question does not show on my screen?

During the event, attendees will be asked to respond to random poll questions several times each hour, throughout the entire day. Zoom users who are using an outdated web browser or have the pop-up blocker in their web browser turned on may not see the poll question. Prior to the event, check your web browser application to make sure it has been updated with the latest version and that the pop-up blocker feature has been turned off. Infrequently, some users reported that keeping the Question-and-Answer Window (Q/A window) open throughout the event can affect the polling question; therefore, please keep the Q/A window closed, unless you are asking the panelist a question. You may also try using a different web browser if you cannot see the poll question. For example, if you normally use Chrome, try switching your browser to Edge or vice versa. If you inadvertently miss one question due to a technical difficulty, this will not impact your Certificate of Completion.

#### Can I call into the Property Tax Academy from my analog phone?


No. Attendees must use an internet-enabled device with sound, such as a tablet, smart phone, or computer to participate in the Property Tax Academy. Attendees do not need a microphone or camera to attend. Attendees are required to use the Zoom app to respond to poll questions throughout the training.

# What happens if my device is having a technical issue, or I lose Internet - will I still get credit?

#### What are some helpful hints to prepare in advance for the event?
