## **OMP Introduction – Mission and Vision Statements**

- Mission Statement To ensure the health and safety of all Mainers by effectively and responsibly licensing and regulating marijuana establishments.
- **Vision Statement** Develop a good faith partnership between the State of Maine and stakeholders by establishing rules and policies that provide interested consumers with access to a regulated industry while diminishing an unregulated, untested illicit market.



## **Purview of OMP as a Regulator**

#### **Center for Disease Control** and Prevention

• Retail Tobacco License

 Food Processing, Food Establishment, Beverage Plant Licenses

#### Department of Environmental Protection

• Waste, Air, Water, Land Permitting



#### Maine Law: Adult Use vs. Medical Use

#### Marijuana Legalization Act (Adult Use) – Title 28-B

- <u>Consumer-centric.</u>
- Legalizes the use, sale, and taxation of marijuana for adult use purposes.
- State Licensing.

#### Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act – Title 22, Chapter 558-C

- <u>Patient-centric.</u>
- Legalizes the use, sale, and taxation of marijuana for medical use.
- State Registration.



# Maine Law: Adult Use vs. Medical Use (cont.)

#### Adult Use

- Mandatory Testing.
- State and Federal Background Checks.
- Excise and Sales Tax.
- Universal Symbol.
- Edible THC Limits.
- Fines, Penalties, Administrative Holds, Suspension, Revocation

#### **Medical Use**

- Voluntary Testing.
- State Background Checks.
- Sales Tax.
- "Edible marijuana … must include a signifier…"
- No Edible THC limits.
- Suspension and Revocation.



# Adult Use vs. Medical Use: Types of Establishments

#### Adult Use

- Marijuana Stores
- Cultivation Facilities
  - Nurseries
- Manufacturing Facilities
- Marijuana Testing Facilities

#### **Medical Use**

- Registered Caregivers
  - Caregiver Retail Stores
- Registered Dispensaries
- Manufacturing Facilities\*
- Marijuana Testing Facilities\*



#### What is a Caregiver Retail Store?

# 22 M.R.S. § 2422(1-F) - A store with attributes generally associated with retail stores, including, but not limited to:

- 1. A fixed location
- 2. A sign
- 3. Regular business hours
- 4. Accessibility to the public
- 5. Sales of goods directly to the consumer

# A retail store is used by a registered caregiver to offer marijuana for sale to patients.



#### **Adult Use and Medical Use: Licensing Process**

#### **Adult Use**

- 1. Conditional License
- 2. Local Authorization
- 3. Active License

OMP has 90 days to make a decision on a conditional license application.

#### **Medical Use**

- 1. Application
- 2. Local Authorization\*

OMP has 30 days to make a decision.



#### Adult Use and Medical Use: The Role of Municipalities

#### Adult Use

- Must affirmatively opt-in for any type of establishment.
  - No grandfathering.
- Must provide local authorization before OMP issues active license.

#### **Medical Use**

- Must opt-in for establishments other than caregivers.
  - Facilities operating with municipal approval prior to December 13, 2018 grandfathered.
- Limited role in state registration process.

#### **Adult Use and Medical Use: Tax Structure**

#### **Medical Marijuana**

- 5.5 percent general sales tax rate at retail. Edibles at 8 percent rate.
- No excise tax.

#### **Adult Use Marijuana**

- 10 percent sales tax rate at retail.
- Excise tax on weight or quantity of product.

Marijuana flower	\$335/pound		
Marijuana trim	\$94/pound		
Immature plant or seedling	\$1.50/plant or seedling		
Marijuana seed	\$0.30/seed		
Mature marijuana plant	\$35/plant

- Assists OMP in ensuring program compliance.
- Prevents diversion to the illicit market.
- Assists in ensuring consumer safety.
