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## Governor Mills Considering Conformity Legislation in Response to Recent Federal Tax Law Changes

Maine Revenue Services (MRS) has received inquiries regarding Maine's response to the federal Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) and the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

These acts contain several federal tax provisions that affect Maine tax laws, including retroactive changes back to tax years beginning in 2018 and 2019. Because, under current state law, Maine conforms to the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) as amended through December 31, 2019, taxpayers filing their 2019 Maine income tax returns by July 15<sup>th</sup> should do so without regard to federal tax provisions enacted after December 31, 2019.

Prior to July 15<sup>th</sup>, MRS will provide guidance and taxpayer instructions on how to file 2019 Maine income tax returns in accordance with current State tax law, in light of these recent federal changes.

Governor Janet T. Mills continues to review the recent federal tax law changes and is considering the extent to which the Administration will propose legislation conforming to certain new federal tax provisions. Additional federal tax legislation is also anticipated next month, and a new State revenue forecast is scheduled to be released by August 1<sup>st</sup>.
