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Updated 2025 State of Maine Individual Income Tax Rates

As is required by State statute, Maine Individual Income Tax rates have been updated for inflation for 2025. Tax-rate schedules for tax years beginning in 2025 are available at: maine.gov/revenue/sites/maine.gov.revenue/files/inline-files/ind tax rate sched 2025.pdf.

For tax years beginning in 2025, an inflation adjustment is made by multiplying the cost-of-living adjustment, 1.274, by the lowest dollar amounts of the tax-rate tables specified in 36 M.R.S. §§ 5111(1-F), 5111(2-F), and 5111(3-F) and by multiplying the cost-of-living adjustment, 1.269, by the highest dollar amounts of the same tax-rate tables. The Maine personal exemption amount is adjusted by multiplying the cost-of-living adjustment, 1.25, by the dollar amount of the personal exemption specified in 36 M.R.S. § 5126-A(1), for a taxpayer and taxpayer's spouse, if married. See 36 M.R.S. § 5403. The Maine standard deduction amount is equal to the federal standard deduction amount.
