Maine Adopts Emergency Rule Regarding Adult Use Marijuana

The Office of Marijuana Policy ("OMP") has adopted an emergency rule regarding the excise taxes on the sales, purchases, and transfers of adult use marijuana flower, trim, and mature marijuana plants. *See* 18-691 C.M.R., Ch. 3, available at: <u>www.maine.gov/dafs/omp/adult-use/rules-statutes/18-691-C.M.R.-ch.-3</u>). This emergency rule is effective August 20, 2020.

The Marijuana Excise Tax return has been updated to incorporate the 75% reduction in weight for so-called "wet" marijuana flower, trim, and mature marijuana plants as specified by the OMP rule. OMP issued the first active licenses Tuesday, September 8, 2020. *See* "Office of Marijuana Policy Unveils New Details on Planned Launch of Adult Use Marijuana in Maine," available at: www.maine.gov/dafs/omp/news-events/news/aump-license-sale-dates-2020. Currently, the first Maine Marijuana Excise Tax return is due Thursday, October 15, 2020.
