

State of Maine Secretary of State – Bureau of Motor Vehicles

Instructions to Driver License/ID Card Applicants

Individuals applying for a Maine driver license or state identification card must establish that they are lawfully present in the United States.

If a document is submitted as documentary evidence of legal presence in the United States in any language other than English, a complete written English translation of the document and the Certificate of Translation must accompany the foreign language document.

Instructions to Person Preparing the Certificate of Translation

- 1. Provide a complete printed or typed English translation of the foreign document to the applicant.
- 2. Complete, sign and date the Certificate of Translation and provide to the applicant.
- 3. Keep a copy of the translated document and certificate for your records.

I understand that the making of a false statement which I do not believe is true, construes Unsworn Falsification, a criminal offense pursuant to 17-A M.R.S.A. Section 453. I fully understand if this statement is untrue and falsely made, I am subject to prosecution for the crime of Unsworn Falsification. I further understand that Unsworn Falsification is a class "D" crime punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 or by imprisonment of up to one year, or both.
