# For Joint Owners (Title states "joint ownership")

Under the terms of "joint" ownership, when a joint owner dies the surviving owner(s) retains complete ownership of the vehicle. A surviving joint owner may title the vehicle in their name by submitting a title application in the survivor's name.

## What you will need:

- □ A Vehicle Title
  - If you cannot locate the title to the vehicle, you will need to file a Duplicate
     Title Application (MVT 8).
  - o The fee is waived for a Duplicate Title Application in this case.
- □ Application for Certificate of Title (MVT–2)
  - An application for a Maine certificate of title can be obtained by visiting any
    of our motor vehicle branch or town office locations or by contacting the Title
    Unit in Augusta.
  - If you were a joint owner with a person other than your spouse, a \$33 fee will apply.
  - o This fee will also apply if you are adding an additional name to the title.
  - o If rush service is preferred, a \$10 rush fee will apply.
- ☐ A copy of the deceased's death certificate

## \*If a surviving joint owner sells the vehicle, the survivor should provide the buyer with:

- The title transferred to the buyer
- A release of any lien
- A copy of the deceased's death certificate or form MVT-22 completed by the survivor.
- Bill of Sale.
