# **Old Business and Public Comment**

- Update on drafting a MePCSW member handbook/policy manual discuss next steps

### **New Business and MePCSW Governance**

- 1. Updates:
  - a. Governor's budget \$5,000 for MeCSW
    - Discussion about historical underfunding of efforts to advance women's wellbeing, the need for sufficient resources to do our work, opportunities to broaden impact through partnerships, opportunities to illustrate our value to policymakers
- 2. Bill submitted by Rep. Lynn Copeland on cloture day (language below)
  - a. Resolve, to Study Pay Disparities in Gendered Workforces Resolved; that the Permanent Commission on the Status of Women, established under Title 5, Chapter 371-A, and referred to in this resolve as "the Commission," shall study the extent of occupational or workforce segregation in Maine by gender; and assess any disparities in safety or compensation related to that workforce segregation. The Commission shall

submit a report on such findings to the 132nd Maine Legislature by January 15, 2026.

- 3. Invitation to speak and exhibit at Inclusion Maine Conference committee supportive of exploring this opportunity
- 4. Discussion about strategic planning in 2025
  - a. Discuss approach and timeline
  - b. Facilitator for discussions in February and April (working with Dept. of SOS staff to identify a facilitator)
  - c. Discussed survey questions for members and consensus about adding questions that ask specifically about opportunities and threats facing Maine women, as well as issues impacting MePCSW
  - d. Suggestion to share information about existing work streams and identified priorities to give members context
- 5. Maine ERA for All campaign brief update, teeing up for discussion of Commission support at February meeting
- 6. Committee member sharing and other new business?
  - a. Anne's project gathering stories from Maine women who have lived experience with sex discrimination
