- 1. Strategic Planning

 - ii. Want to ensure that each goal/action step has metrics to measure success tie these to ED performance review process if possible

 - 1. Suggestion to build shared bank of materials for having conversations with legislators (pre-drafted questions etc.)
 - 2. Position the MePCSW as an entity that can hear from and convey to legislators about the concerns of their constituents
