**Old Business and Public Comment**

1. Review February meeting minutes

**New Business and MePCSW Governance**

1. Strategic Planning
  - a. Discussed initial feedback on draft strategic goals and overview of proposed updates.
    - i. Suggestion to make sure that language in goals is measurable (e.g., what do we mean by “strengthen”)
  - b. Discussion about role of MePCSW – consideration of partners and avoiding duplication, thinking about how to connect communities with the work of the Commission without overtaxing resources
  - c. Opportunities for future surveys – consider including names with survey results to get a better sense of how to engage members and who is not engaged – “people vote with their bodies”
2. Legislative updates:

- a. L.D. 522 “Resolve, Directing the Permanent Commission on the Status of Women to Study the Extent of Workforce Gender Segregation in the State” – divided report
  - b. L.D. 135 “An Act to Provide Compensation to Members of the Permanent Commission on the Status of Women to Enhance Equitable Commission Participation from Across the State” – unanimous report with amendment
