

How to use reCAPTCHA v2 with AutoForms

1. Place the following in the head of your html page:


```
<script src="https://www.google.com/recaptcha/api.js" async defer></script>
```

2. Place the following code at the end of your form, before your submit button:

```
<div class="g-recaptcha" data-sitekey="6LdQECITAAAAADVEVQxos43IQjgq7ds6dV94XFcu"></div>
```


Note: 6LdQECITAAAAADVEVQxos43IQjgq7ds6dV94XFcu is the key that is needed for it to work

3. Log in to your AutoForms account and check the reCAPTCHA checkbox at the top of your form definition:
